“ITALIAN EQUITY ROADSHOW” OF BORSA ITALIANA SINGAPORE, 30 SEPTEMBER TOKYO, 3 OCTOBER 2011

Tomorrow Friday 30 September the “Italian Equity Roadshow 2011” of Borsa Italiana arrives in Singapore. The Roadshow will then move to Tokyo and conclude on Monday 3 October. This year’s roadshow took in New York, Toronto, Stockholm, and Frankfurt.

Organized in partnership with Nomura and the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the established event brings together listed Italian large caps and Asian investors, and this year includes the following companies:

This is the first time that Borsa Italiana has visited the Eastern investor hub of Singapore, famed for its receptive attitudes towards international

investment opportunities, and the eight time that Borsa Italiana has visited Tokyo.

A significant number, 109, of scheduled meetings between the management of companies present and investors have been timetabled: 44 of these will take place in Singapore and 65 in Tokyo, either as “one-to-one” or “group meetings”.

There are 40 investors participating and over 25 relevant local investment firms represented, 8 of whom based in Singapore and 17 in Tokyo.

The roadshow will end, as usual, with the traditional dinner at the Italian Embassy in Tokyo.

Borsa Italiana's Italian Global Equity Roadshow 2011 allows the top management of some the most important Italian listed companies to meet international investors through a series of global events, through the more than 300 meetings organized with 120 international investors representing 80 leading investment houses.
