Andrea Sironi has been Chairman of Borsa Italiana SpA since January 2016. He has served as Rector of Bocconi University in Milan since 20012 and is a Professor of Banking and Finance. Previous roles at Bocconi include acting as Dean of the Graduate School, Dean for International Affairs, Director of the Research Division of the School of Management (SDA), Director of the MSc in Finance, and Director of the Master in Risk Management.

Since December 2014, he has been Chairman of CEMS, the Global Alliance in Management Education. He has also held visiting positions at the Research and Statistics Department of the Federal Reserve Board of Governors in Washington D.C. and at the Stern School of Business of New

York University. He began his career as a financial analyst at Chase Manhattan Bank in London. His academic research and publications focus on Financial Risk Management and International Banking Supervision. He was a non executive director of Banco Popolare Scarl from 2008 to 2013 and of Saes Getters SpA from 2007 to 2015.
